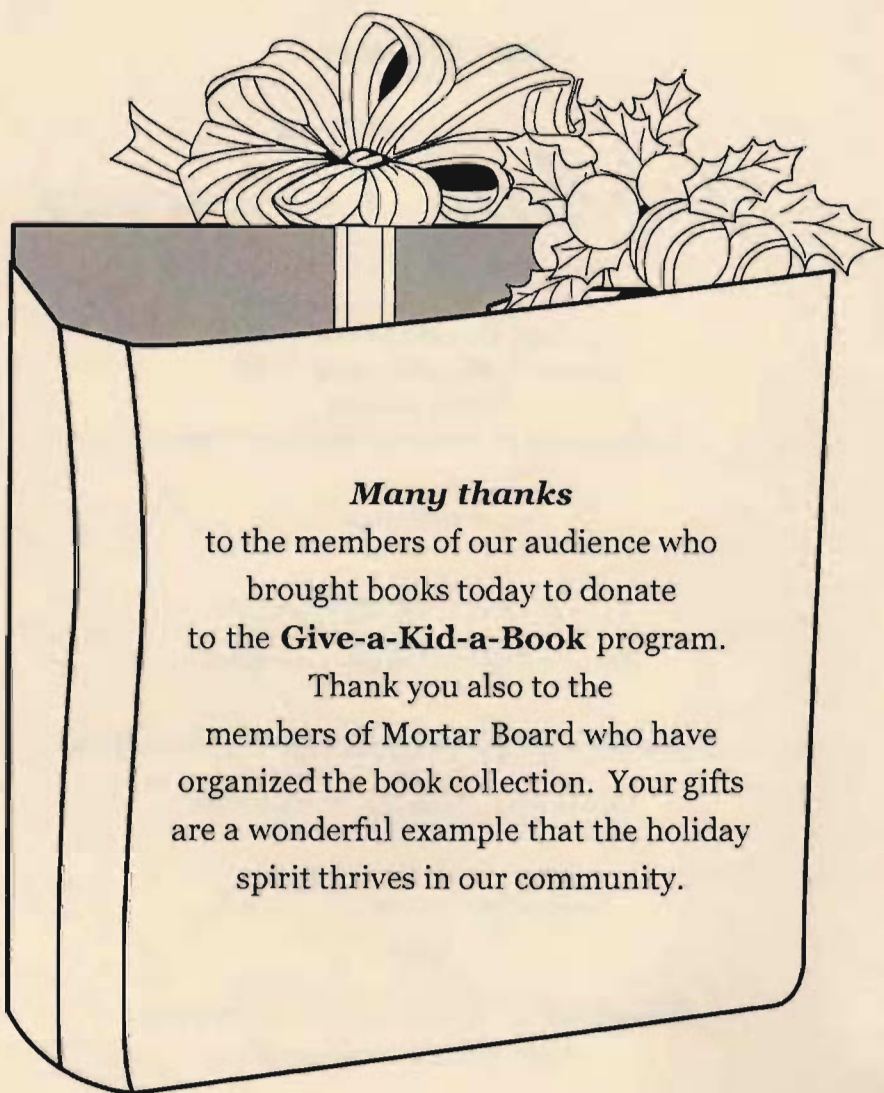




*Greetings from the

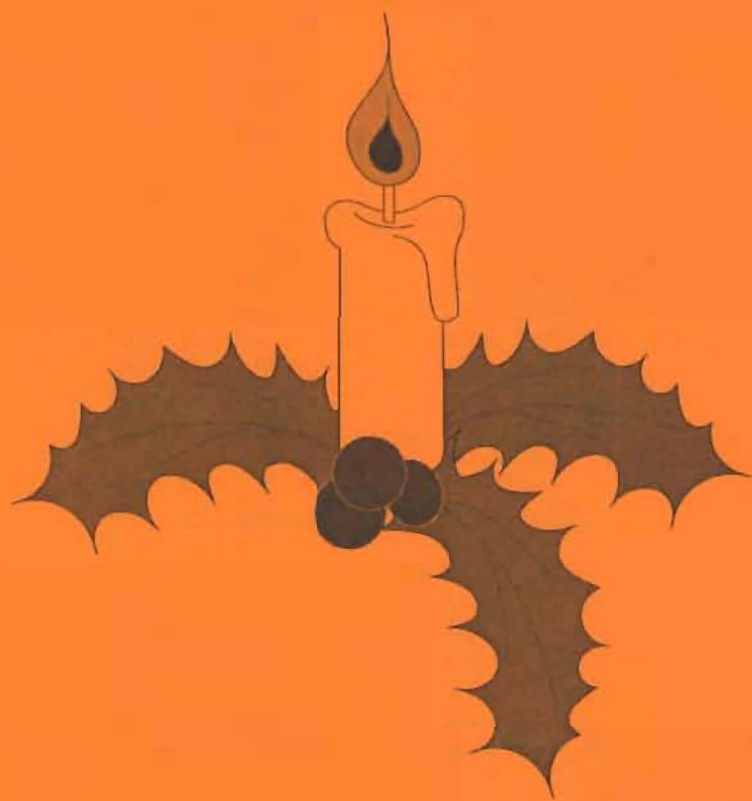
