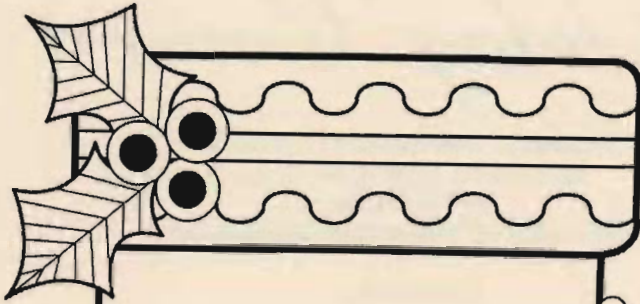

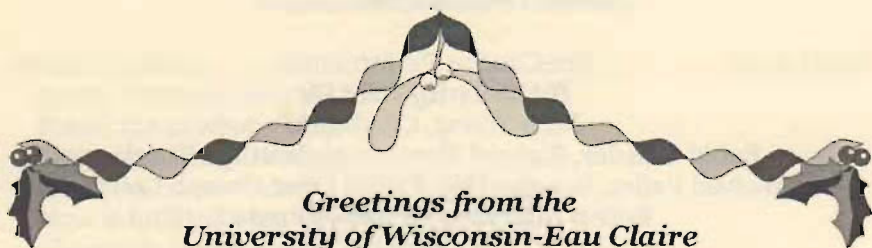

The White Paper sets out a vision for older people, and a strategy for achieving it. The vision is that older people should be able to live well, and to contribute to society. The strategy is to improve the lives of older people by addressing their needs in a number of key areas.

The White Paper identifies four key areas of need for older people: health, social care, housing, and income. It sets out a range of measures to address these needs, including: improving access to health services, increasing the availability of social care services, improving the quality of housing for older people, and increasing the income of older people.

The White Paper also sets out a range of measures to improve the lives of older people in other areas, including: improving access to transport, increasing the availability of leisure and cultural activities, and improving the quality of life in rural areas.

The White Paper is a landmark document in the history of social policy in the UK. It sets out a clear vision for the future of older people, and a strategy for achieving it. It is a document that should be read by all those who are concerned with the welfare of older people.
